Storage	good, when harvested overripe the fruits have a tendency to be dry and mealy
Tree:	
Vigour	weak to medium strong, weaker side wood, only medium proneness to peach leaf curl
Crop load	medium to high, because of the typical preharvest fruit drop the fruits should be picked underripe
Evaluation:	Very late ripening, robust variety, which has been further selected over time. Less suitable for dessert fruits, but very suitable for processing, distilling and for producing fine liqueurs and jam.

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
